Grounding Requirements

Metal distribution boxes must always be grounded to ensure safety. This involves connecting a ground wire from the box to a central grounding point or grounding system, which helps safely channel fault currents into the earth, protecting both personnel and equipment from electric shock and damage . In the US, a 10 AWG ground wire is commonly used, while other markets may require a 6 mm² wire . Proper grounding ensures low resistance (typically
