Secondary distribution boxes include surface-mounted, flush-mounted, pole-mounted, single-phase, three-phase, lighting, power, and control distribution boxes.

Secondary distribution boxes, also known as DB boxes, are used to safely distribute electrical power from a main supply to multiple downstream circuits, typically after the primary distribution stage . They house protective devices such as circuit breakers or fuses and are essential for organizing, protecting, and controlling electrical connections in residential, commercial, and industrial systems .

Common Types of Secondary Distribution Boxes

- o Surface-Mounted Distribution Boxes: Installed directly on walls, suitable for retrofits and industrial environments .
- o Flush-Mounted Distribution Boxes: Embedded into walls for a clean appearance, commonly used in residential and commercial buildings .
- o Pole-Mounted Distribution Boxes: Designed for outdoor use, including street lighting and utility applications .
- o Single-Phase DB Boxes: Ideal for residential properties and small commercial loads .
- o Three-Phase DB Boxes: Used in industrial and large commercial facilities requiring higher power capacity .
- o Lighting Distribution Boxes: Dedicated to managing lighting circuits with appropriate protection .
- o Power Distribution Boxes: Support sockets, equipment, and heavy machinery .
- o Control Distribution Boxes: Integrate control components such as relays, contactors, and timers for automation or specialized control circuits .

Secondary distribution boxes can also be classified based on installation environment and enclosure material :

- o Indoor Distribution Boxes: Used in protected environments like homes, offices, or utility rooms.
- o Outdoor Distribution Boxes: Built for exposure to rain, dust, sunlight, and temperature variations, often requiring higher IP ratings.
- o Metal Enclosures: Provide mechanical strength and durability for industrial applications.
- o Plastic Enclosures: Lightweight, corrosion-resistant, and suitable for residential or light commercial use. These boxes ensure safety, organization, and accessibility for maintenance, testing, and troubleshooting, making them a critical component of secondary electrical distribution systems .
