Cable tray FD markings indicate the cable type, voltage rating, environmental suitability, and compliance with standards such as UL 1277 or IEC 61537.

Key Components of Tray Cable Markings

Tray cable markings provide essential information for safe installation and compliance. A typical marking might read: 12 AWG 3C TC-ER-JP SUN RES DIR BUR 600V 90C DRY / 75C WET UL 1277 .

- o Wire Gauge and Conductor Count: 12 AWG 3C indicates 12-gauge wire with 3 conductors, which affects ampacity and voltage drop.
- o Cable Type: TC stands for Tray Cable, compliant with UL 1277 standards.
- o Exposed Run: ER means the cable can be run exposed outside the tray for limited distances without conduit, meeting crush and impact tests.
- o Jacket Type: JP (Jacketed Power) indicates a multiconductor jacketed cable.
- o Sunlight Resistance: SUN RES or Sunlight Resistant ensures the cable can withstand UV exposure, critical for outdoor or rooftop installations .
- o Direct Burial: DIR BUR indicates the cable is suitable for underground installation without additional conduit.
- o Voltage Rating: 600V specifies the maximum operating voltage.
- o Temperature Rating: 90C DRY / 75C WET shows the maximum operating temperature in dry and wet environments.
- o Standards Compliance: UL 1277 confirms the cable meets UL testing for tray cables, including mechanical and environmental performance .

Additional Considerations

- o Material and Sheathing: Tray cables may use XLPE, UV-stabilized PVC, or fluoropolymers (FEP/PTFE) for resistance to heat, moisture, chemicals, and sunlight .
- o Installation Environment: Markings help installers select cables suitable for indoor, outdoor, rooftop, or direct burial applications.
- o International Standards: In addition to UL, IEC 61537 provides guidelines for cable tray systems, including mechanical strength, corrosion resistance, and electrical continuity .

Practical Tips

- o Always verify UV and direct burial ratings before outdoor installation.
- o Use black or dark jackets for maximum natural UV protection.
