

Cable tray climbing technique

Article Overview

Cable tray climbing operations require careful planning, proper material handling, secure support installation, and strict adherence to safety protocols to ensure safe and efficient elevated installation.

Preparation and Planning

Before starting the operation, ensure the work area is cleared and accessible, with civil and MEP clearances obtained. Review the approved shop drawings to confirm tray routes, lengths, and elevations. Identify potential clashes with other services and maintain a minimum clearance of 150 mm from mechanical systems. Inspect all materials, including trays, ladders, and fittings, for damage or discrepancies, and remove unsuitable items from the site .

Material Handling

- o Offload trays carefully using overhead cranes or forklifts, ensuring slings or supports do not crush the trays. Only single bundles should be lifted at a time, and trays should never be used as lifting points .
- o Store trays horizontally on flat surfaces with timber supports at intervals of approximately 1 meter, protecting them from moisture and direct sunlight .
- o Stack trays by width and type, ensuring proper drainage if uncovered, and avoid placing them in high-traffic areas .

Installation Steps

- o Marking and Routing: Mark horizontal and vertical tray routes according to approved drawings. Adjust only if site conditions require, with consultant approval .
- o Support Installation: Fix threaded rod supports with metal plugs, 'L' angles, or slotted 'C' channels. Maintain a maximum distance of 1.2 meters between supports to prevent sagging. Provide additional support for bends, branches, and offsets .
- o Tray Placement: Lift trays into position using cranes or manual handling with proper safety measures. Ensure trays are level and aligned, and secure with clamps or screws. Cover roof-level trays exposed to sunlight .
- o Cutting and Fitting: Cut trays to required lengths using appropriate tools. Remove burrs and sharp edges, and treat cut surfaces with zinc-rich paint to prevent corrosion .
- o Cable Pulling Clearance: Ensure sufficient space between trays for cable installation and future maintenance .

Safety Measures

- o Only trained and competent personnel should perform elevated tray installation .

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- o Ladder trays are not to be used as walkways or lifting apparatus; they are strictly for cable support .
- o All operatives must attend safety induction and carry valid identification and training records .
- o Inspect the work area for unsafe conditions and do not proceed until hazards are corrected .
- o Use personal protective equipment (PPE) such as helmets, gloves, and fall protection harnesses when working at height .

Inspection and Quality Assurance

- o Supervisors should monitor installation for compliance with approved drawings and safety standards .
- o QA/QC inspectors verify that procedures are followed, supports are correctly installed, and all documentation is complete .
- o Ensure all fittings are manufacturer-approved and properly installed to prevent damage to cables during pulling .
