

# Cables in cable trays can have joints

- o Avoid positioning them directly at tray expansion joints, as movement can stress the joint.
- o Ensure the tray supports the joint firmly but allows some flexibility to prevent mechanical strain during thermal expansion .
- o Follow standards such as NEC Section 300-7(b) and NEMA VE 1, which provide guidance on spacing and support for trays and expansion joints .

## Best Practices

- o Use dedicated support brackets or trays for joints if the cable run is long or heavily loaded.
- o Inspect joints regularly for signs of overheating, sagging, or moisture ingress.
- o Maintain the minimum bend radius for cables exiting the joint to avoid mechanical stress .

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o Ensure proper installation by trained personnel familiar with cable tray and joint standards .
