Only a licensed and insured electrician should perform this work, as it is considered notifiable work under building regulations . **Safety and Testing:** Before relocation, all circuits must be fully tested and inspected to identify any wiring faults or risks of electric shock. Hidden faults must be corrected before extending or rerouting cables . Power must be de-energized at the main breaker, and verification with a non-contact voltage tester is essential . **Cable Management:** The existing cables must be long enough to reach the new location without straining connections. If cables are buried in walls, they may need to be rerouted or connected via surface-mounted junction boxes to comply with safety standards . Proper cable management, correct wire gauge, and secure connections are critical to prevent short circuits or fire hazards . **Location and Installation:** The new location should be dry, accessible, and well-ventilated, typically around 1.5 meters from the floor. The distribution box must be rated appropriately for the environment (IP/NEMA rating) and capable of handling the load of all circuits . Protection devices such as breakers, fuses, and surge protectors should be installed for each circuit. **Legal Compliance:** Relocation requires permits and inspections from local building authorities. Compliance with NEC, IEC, or local electrical codes is mandatory, and all work must be documented for future inspections .

Steps Involved

- o Plan the relocation: Determine the new location, check cable lengths, and ensure the box can accommodate all circuits.
 - o De-energize circuits: Turn off the main breaker and verify power is off using a voltage tester.
 - o Inspect and repair wiring: Test all circuits for faults and repair any damaged wiring.
 - o Install the new box: Mount the distribution box securely, ensuring proper grounding and ventilation.
 - o Reroute or extend wiring: Connect all circuits to the new box, using junction boxes if necessary.
 - o Test and inspect: Verify all connections, test breakers, and ensure compliance with safety codes.
 - o Obtain inspection approval: Have the work inspected and approved by local authorities before powering on.
