Clustered optical cables using LC and FC connectors combine high-density LC interfaces with precision FC connectors for reliable, flexible fiber optic networks.

Overview of LC and FC Connectors

LC (Lucent Connector) is a small form factor (SFF) connector with a 1.25mm ferrule, designed for high-density applications. It uses a push-pull latching mechanism similar to an RJ45 clip, making it ideal for data centers, enterprise LANs, and high-density patch panels. LC connectors support duplex links and are widely used for 10G to 400G duplex SMF/MMF connections, including SFP/SFP+ and QSFP transceivers . FC (Ferrule Connector) features a round screw-on design with a 2.5mm ferrule, providing high precision and stability. FC connectors are commonly used in telecom, datacom, and measurement equipment where vibration resistance and precise alignment are critical. They are gradually being replaced by LC and SC connectors in high-density deployments due to easier handling and faster connection .

Clustered Optical Cable Concept

A clustered optical cable refers to a cable assembly that groups multiple fibers together, often combining different connector types (e.g., LC on one end, FC on the other) to interface between high-density patch panels and legacy or specialized equipment. These cables are used to:

- o Connect high-density LC patch panels to FC-equipped transceivers or instruments
- o Enable duplex or multi-fiber connections in compact spaces
- o Support data center backbones, enterprise networks, and telecom ODNs
- o Facilitate breakout topologies, where a multi-fiber trunk splits into individual LC or FC connections

Advantages of LC-FC Clustered Cables

- o High-density deployment: LC connectors double port density compared to SC, allowing more fibers per rack unit.
- o Reliable alignment: FC connectors provide precise ferrule alignment, reducing insertion loss and back reflection.
- o Flexibility: Duplex or multi-fiber configurations allow easy adaptation to different network architectures.
- o Compatibility: Supports both modern SFP/SFP+ transceivers and legacy FC-based equipment.

Considerations

- o Cleaning and maintenance: Smaller LC ferrules require careful cleaning; FC connectors need proper torque

- o Insertion/extraction: LC push-pull is fast but may need extraction tools in tight clusters; FC requires careful threading.

- o Cable management: Clustered cables must be routed to avoid bending below minimum bend radius, especially in high-density racks.
