Electrical distribution boxes use standardized color codes to identify live, neutral, and ground conductors, ensuring safety and compliance with IEC and NEC standards.

IEC 60446 / 60445 Color Codes (International Standard)

- o Live Conductors (Phases):
 - o Phase 1: Brown
 - o Phase 2: Red
 - o Phase 3: Blue
- o Neutral Conductor: Black, Grey, or White
- o Protective Earth (Ground): Yellow/Green striped
- o Special AC or RCD Circuits: Purple or Orange These colors are used in industrial, commercial, and residential installations to prevent miswiring and ensure clear identification of each conductor's function ().

NEC / CEC Color Codes (US & Canada)

- o Live (Hot) Wires: Commonly Black, Red, or Blue for single-phase and three-phase systems; other colors may be used for additional phases ().
- o Neutral Wire: White or Grey
- o Protective Ground: Green, Green/Yellow, or Bare Copper
- o High Voltage or Industrial Systems: Three-phase 208V, 277V, 480V, or 600V systems follow similar conventions, with phase colors varying by local practice ().

Single-Phase vs. Three-Phase Wiring

- o Single-Phase (Residential): One live wire, one neutral, one ground; typically 120V or 240V.
- o Three-Phase (Industrial/Commercial): Three live wires (phases), one neutral, one ground; typically 208V, 480V, or 600V. Phase colors follow IEC or local standards ().

Safety and Installation Tips

- o Always power off before working on the distribution box.
- o Test wires with a multimeter to confirm voltage and polarity.
- o Label wires for easier maintenance and troubleshooting.
- o Follow local codes and national standards (NEC, CEC, IEC).
