Zhangjiajie Glass Bridge, China This modern bridge features a transparent glass floor suspended over a canyon nearly 1,000 feet deep. While structurally sound, the visual effect of walking on glass above a massive drop induces intense fear, challenging even confident walkers . Monkey Bridges, Vietnam Found in the Mekong Delta, these bridges consist of a single bamboo log with a flimsy handrail, often suspended over streams or gullies. Crossing requires agility and balance, and the bridges are particularly dangerous for those unfamiliar with their design . U Bein Bridge, Myanmar Spanning Taungthaman Lake, this 19th-century teakwood bridge is the longest of its kind. While largely intact, the decaying wooden pillars and slippery surface make it hazardous, especially during wet conditions . Trift Bridge, Switzerland A narrow suspension bridge over the Trift Glacier, it sways with the wind and sits at high altitude, offering breathtaking views but a challenging crossing for those unaccustomed to heights .
