- o Busbars: Copper or aluminum bars behind breakers distribute power efficiently. Using comb busbars reduces wiring clutter and improves safety .

- o Top layer: Incoming main power cables enter the box and connect to the main switch.

- o Middle layer: Busbars and branch circuit breakers are mounted, with wires routed neatly to each breaker.

- o Bottom layer: Neutral and earth connections, including grounding bars, are organized to avoid interference with live circuits .

- o Separation of circuits: High-current and low-current circuits should be physically separated to reduce electromagnetic interference and heat buildup .

- o Grounding wires must be securely connected to the earth bar and the metal enclosure. Parallel grounding points are preferred over sequential links to reduce resistance and improve safety .

- o Ensure all metal surfaces are clean and conductive; oxidation or dirt can increase resistance and compromise protection .

- o Use proper wire gauges for each circuit and ensure insulation is intact.

- o Include protective devices like fuses, surge protectors, and breakers for each circuit .

- o Label all wires and breakers clearly to facilitate maintenance and future upgrades .

- o Follow local electrical codes (NEC, IEC) and use certified components (UL/CE) for safety .

- o Perform visual inspections and multimeter tests before powering on.

- o Schedule regular maintenance to check for loose connections, corrosion, or insulation wear .
