ADSS (All-Dielectric Self-Supporting) fiber optic cables are fully non-metallic, self-supporting aerial cables ideal for power line and telecom installations in the Dominican Republic.

Overview of ADSS Fiber Optic Cable

ADSS cables are designed to support themselves between poles or towers without metal elements, making them suitable for high-voltage environments and aerial installations along power lines . They are lightweight, small in diameter, and resistant to environmental factors such as wind, ice, UV exposure, and moisture . The dielectric structure eliminates induced voltages, allowing installation without grounding or messenger wires .

Technical Features

- o Fiber Count: Typically ranges from 12 to 432 fibers, with common configurations including 12, 48, 96, and 144 fibers .
- o Fiber Type: Single-mode or multimode fibers, often G.652D standard for long-distance transmission .
- o Sheath Options: Polyethylene (PE) for standard environments or Anti-Tracking (AT) for high-voltage installations above 110 kV .
- o Strength Members: Aramid yarns, FRP rods, or other non-metallic reinforcements provide tensile strength and torque balance .
- o Water Protection: Loose tubes filled with water-blocking gel or tape prevent moisture ingress .
- o Span Lengths: Depending on design, ADSS cables can span 100 meters up to 1500 meters between poles .

- o Power utility transmission lines: Installed along existing high-voltage lines without interrupting service .
- o Telecom backbones: Connecting towns, campuses, or pole-to-building networks .
- o Aerial installations: Ideal for areas where underground cabling is impractical or costly .
