- o **Align the Connectors:** Insert connectors into the adapter, ensuring ferrules are properly aligned to minimize signal loss .
- o **Secure the Connection:** Push connectors firmly into the adapter; some adapters include latches or screws for locking .
- o **Test the Connection:** Verify signal integrity using a fiber optic power meter or OTDR to ensure minimal insertion loss and proper alignment .
