

Fiber optic cable installed in the house

Entry and Routing

The ONT is a critical device that converts optical signals into electrical signals usable by your home network . It should be installed near a power source and close to other networking hardware for efficient distribution. In some setups, the ONT may be combined with a router in a single unit, but often it is separate to allow flexibility and optimal performance .

Cable Selection and Protection

Residential fiber installations typically use single-mode fiber, which supports long distances and high bandwidth . Pre-terminated cables with connectors like SC/APC or LC are preferred to avoid complex splicing . During installation, the fiber should be protected from sharp edges, high-traffic areas, and temperature extremes. Using flexible low-voltage conduit or soft Velcro ties helps prevent damage and maintains signal integrity .

Connecting to Devices

Once the fiber reaches the ONT, it is connected to a router or gateway using an Ethernet cable, which then distributes the internet to devices via Wi-Fi or wired connections . For larger homes, mesh Wi-Fi systems may be added to ensure full coverage. Proper placement of the router in a central location maximizes signal strength and network performance .

Best Practices

- o Avoid tight bends and sharp corners to prevent microbends in the fiber .
- o Use existing conduits or abandoned cable runs to simplify routing .



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- o Keep the ONT and router in a ventilated area away from heat sources .
- o Protect exposed fiber runs with conduit in high-traffic areas . By carefully planning the pathway, selecting appropriate hardware, and protecting the fiber, you can ensure a reliable, high-speed connection throughout your home.
