Faulty or Misconfigured Equipment Modems, ONTs (Optical Network Terminals), or routers with outdated firmware or incorrect settings can cause slow connections. Loose or damaged Ethernet cables, incorrect port connections, or using lower-category cables (e.g., Cat 5 instead of Cat 6) can also contribute to delays . 5. Malware or Background Processes Devices infected with malware or running background updates can consume bandwidth, slowing down internet access times even on a high-speed fiber connection .

- o Restart Your Router and Modem: Power cycling can clear temporary glitches and restore full speed .
- o Upgrade Hardware: Use a router capable of gigabit speeds and ensure Ethernet cables are Cat 6 or higher .
- o Check for Network Congestion: Limit simultaneous heavy usage or schedule large downloads during off-peak hours .
- o Inspect Fiber Connections: Ensure cables are undamaged, properly connected, and free from sharp bends .
- o Update Firmware and Scan Devices: Keep router firmware current and remove malware or unnecessary background programs .
- o Contact Your ISP: If problems persist, your provider can run diagnostics, reset signals, or replace faulty equipment . By addressing these factors, most users can significantly reduce long internet access times and fully utilize the high-speed potential of fiber optic networks.
