Yes, a fiber optic router typically has Ethernet ports to connect devices via network cables, but it usually connects to the fiber line through an ONT rather than directly.

How Fiber Routers Connect

A fiber optic router does not usually accept a fiber optic cable directly unless it has a specialized SFP or SFP+ port designed for optical transceivers . In most home setups, the fiber optic cable from your Internet Service Provider (ISP) terminates at an Optical Network Terminal (ONT), which converts the light-based fiber signal into an electrical Ethernet signal . The router then connects to the ONT using a standard Ethernet cable plugged into the router's WAN port.

Ethernet Ports on Fiber Routers

Fiber routers are equipped with Ethernet ports, often labeled as LAN or WAN, which allow you to connect computers, smart TVs, or other network devices using standard RJ45 cables . These ports carry the converted Ethernet signal from the ONT to your local network, enabling both wired and wireless connectivity throughout your home .

Special Cases

Some advanced routers include SFP/SFP+ slots, which can accept fiber modules directly, allowing the router to interface with fiber without a separate ONT . However, this is uncommon in typical residential installations, where the standard setup involves a separate ONT and Ethernet connection to the router.
