o Match the wire gauge to the breaker: for example, a 20-amp circuit requires 12-gauge wire.

o Enclosure and Protection

o Use a proper distribution box with adequate IP/NEMA rating for the environment (indoor/outdoor) to protect against dust, moisture, and accidental contact .

o Include protection devices such as circuit breakers, fuses, or surge protectors for each branch circuit .

o Ensure all high-voltage connections are contained within the enclosure to prevent arcing or accidental contact .

o Wiring and Mounting

o Securely mount the power strip inside the box using DIN rails or brackets if provided .

o Maintain neat cable management and proper insulation.

o Use approved connectors and terminal blocks for solid, stranded, or finely stranded conductors according to the strip's specifications .

o Compliance and Testing

o Follow local electrical codes (NEC, IEC, or regional standards) and use UL/CE-certified components .

o Perform visual inspections and multimeter tests before powering on to verify correct wiring and grounding .

o Schedule regular maintenance and inspections to ensure long-term reliability.
