

How far is the main distribution box from the secondary distribution box

This ensures that the secondary distribution box is installed in a location that is safely reachable from the main distribution box. 2. **Voltage Drop and Cable Length** Secondary distribution boxes are fed from the low-voltage side of a transformer or main distribution panel. To maintain proper voltage levels, the distance should be minimized to reduce voltage drop. For typical low-voltage systems (120/240 V or 230/400 V), distances of up to 30-50 meters are common in residential or commercial buildings, but longer runs may require larger conductor sizes to compensate for voltage drop . 3. **Installation Layout**

- o **Primary distribution box:** Main panel located in a central distribution room or electrical room, often with bottom entry/exit wiring and copper busbars .
- o **Secondary distribution box:** Sub-panel supplying a specific area, floor, or building section. It can be located in a mechanical room, corridor, or near the load center .
- o **Tertiary distribution:** Final connection to individual devices or units, typically very close to the load.

4. Practical Guidelines

- o Keep secondary boxes as close as possible to the load to reduce cable length and energy loss.
 - o Ensure the route between main and secondary boxes avoids obstacles and allows for future maintenance.
 - o Use proper cable sizing and protective devices (MCBs, RCDs, RCBOs) according to the load and distance .
 - o In multi-story buildings, secondary panels are often installed on each floor, fed from the main panel via riser cables.
5. **Typical Distances**
- o **Residential buildings:** 5-20 meters from the main panel to sub-panels.
 - o **Commercial buildings:** 10-50 meters depending on floor layout and load distribution.
 - o **Industrial sites:** Can exceed 50 meters if large conductors are used and voltage drop is accounted for.
