

How many phases should a construction site electrical distribution box use

- o Safety: Equipped with breakers and fuses to prevent short circuits, overloads, and electrical hazards .

Selection Considerations

When choosing a site box, consider:

- o Total load: Sum of all equipment that will run simultaneously.
 - o Voltage requirements: 230V for standard tools, 400V for high-power machinery.
 - o Compliance: Must meet local standards (e.g., NF C 15-100 in France) and have appropriate IP and IK ratings for outdoor use .
 - o Professional installation: A licensed electrician should connect the box to ensure safety and proper operation .
