

How to assemble a distribution box

- o Route wires neatly using cable ties or wiring channels to prevent tangling and contact with sharp edges .

Label each circuit clearly to facilitate future maintenance and troubleshooting. Consider modular designs for easier upgrades .

Step 6: Safety Checks and Testing

- o Insulation resistance test to ensure no short circuits between wires and the box.
- o Circuit on/off test using a multimeter to verify each circuit functions correctly .
