

How to connect a router to a dedicated fiber optic line

- o Configure Internet Settings: Depending on your ISP, you may need to enter PPPoE credentials or set a VLAN ID. Some ISPs use automatic registration (Easy Login) and do not require manual credentials .
- o Test the Connection: Verify internet speed and connectivity to ensure the router is properly handling the fiber connection .

Compatibility and Optimization

- o Routers designed for DSL or cable (coaxial) inputs are not compatible with fiber; ensure your router is fiber-ready .
- o For full fiber speeds, use routers with Gigabit LAN ports and modern Wi-Fi standards (Wi-Fi 6/6E) to avoid bottlenecks .
- o Enable Quality of Service (QoS) if you use VoIP, gaming, or video conferencing to prioritize critical traffic .

Troubleshooting Tips

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- o If the connection fails, check that the fiber cable is properly seated in the ONT and that the ONT is powered on.
- o Confirm that your router's WAN port supports the speed tier of your fiber plan.
- o Contact your ISP if PPPoE credentials or VLAN settings are required and not provided . By following these steps and ensuring your router is compatible, you can fully leverage the high-speed, low-latency benefits of a dedicated fiber optic connection.
