

How to connect a router to a gigabit fiber optic cable

To connect a gigabit fiber optic cable to a router, you need an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) to convert the fiber signal, then link it to your router via an Ethernet cable.

Required Equipment

- o Connect the ONT to your router: Use an Ethernet cable to link the ONT's LAN/Ethernet port to the router's WAN/Internet port .
- o Power on the router: Wait for the router's indicator lights to confirm a successful connection .
- o Configure the router: Access the router's admin panel via a browser (e.g., 192.168.1.1) to finalize settings and ensure internet connectivity .

Tips for Optimal Performance

- o ONT placement: Keep it within 3 meters of the fiber entry point to minimize signal loss .
- o Cable handling: Avoid sharp bends, dust, or dirt on connectors to prevent signal degradation .
- o Use high-quality Ethernet cables: Cat6a or higher is recommended to maintain gigabit speeds .
- o Power and ventilation: Place both ONT and router near a power source in a dry, ventilated area . Following these steps ensures a stable, high-speed fiber connection capable of delivering gigabit internet to your router and connected devices.
