

How to connect fiber optic cable to network card and router

You cannot connect a fiber optic cable directly to a standard router; you must use an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) to convert the optical signal to Ethernet, which then connects to your router's WAN port.

Required Equipment

- o Optical Network Terminal (ONT): Provided by your ISP, converts light signals from the fiber into electrical signals compatible with routers .
- o Fiber optic cable: Typically single-mode with SC/APC or SC/UPC connectors .
- o Ethernet cable: Cat6 or higher recommended for high-speed data transfer .
- o Router: Must have a WAN or Internet port; some routers support SFP modules for direct fiber input .

Step-by-Step Connection

- o Locate the fiber entry point: This is usually a wall outlet where your ISP's fiber line terminates .
- o Connect the fiber cable to the ONT: Remove protective caps from both the fiber cable and the ONT port. Align the connector carefully and insert until it clicks securely . Handle the fiber by its plastic housing to avoid damage.
- o Power on the ONT: Plug in the ONT and wait for the status lights to stabilize, indicating a successful connection to your ISP's network .
- o Bridge the ONT to your router: Use an Ethernet cable to connect the ONT's LAN or Ethernet output port to the router's WAN/Internet port .
- o Power on the router: After the ONT is fully operational, turn on your router and wait for it to boot. Check the router's indicator lights to confirm connectivity .
- o Configure the router: Access the router's admin panel via a web browser (commonly 192.168.1.1 or 192.168.0.1). Enter ISP credentials if required and update firmware for optimal performance .

Tips for Optimal Setup

- o Place the ONT and router near a power source and in a dry, ventilated area .
- o Use high-quality Ethernet cables (Cat6a or higher) to maintain fiber speeds .
- o Avoid bending or stressing the fiber cable; even small kinks can degrade performance .
- o If your router supports SFP modules, you may connect fiber directly to the router using a compatible transceiver, bypassing the ONT, but this requires ISP support . By following these steps, you ensure a stable, high-speed fiber connection from your ISP to your router network card, enabling reliable internet access throughout your network .
