

How to connect secondary wiring to a power distribution cabinet

- o Connect wires to terminals using appropriate crimped or soldered connections. Ensure each wire is securely fastened to prevent loose contacts.
- o Follow color coding and numbering as per the design to maintain clarity and safety.
- o Verify continuity and insulation resistance using a multimeter before energizing the cabinet.

Safety and Verification

- o Ensure all secondary circuits are properly grounded and that neutral and protective earth connections comply with local electrical codes .
- o After wiring, perform a functional test of all components and circuits to confirm correct operation.
