

How to cut cable trays for climbing slopes

Planning and Measurement

Tools and Equipment

- o Saws: Use a band saw or circular saw with a blade suitable for the tray material (metal or FRP). For light channels, a cordless circular saw with a chip collector is recommended. Angle grinders can be used for flexibility but require careful handling due to sparks and debris.
- o Clamps or Vise: Secure the tray firmly to prevent movement during cutting.
- o Deburring Tools: Smooth sharp edges after cutting to prevent injury and facilitate installation.
- o Protective Gear: Wear Kevlar gloves, safety glasses, head protection, and appropriate footwear.

Cutting Technique

- o Mark the Cut Line: Use a tape measure and marker to outline the V-cut according to calculated dimensions.
- o Secure the Tray: Clamp the tray to a stable surface to prevent shifting.
- o Perform the Cut: Follow the marked line carefully. For metal trays, a band saw or circular saw is preferred; avoid torches as they can weaken the material.
- o Deburr Edges: Use a file or deburring tool to remove sharp edges and prevent cable damage.
- o Check Fit: Test the tray on the slope before final installation to ensure proper alignment and clearance.

Safety and Material Considerations

- o Avoid mixing cutting blades between stainless steel and carbon steel to prevent galvanic corrosion.
- o Protect surrounding materials from sparks and overheating.
- o For FRP trays, angle grinders are not suitable; use saws designed for composite materials.
- o Follow local and national HSE regulations for on-site cutting.

Installation Tips

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- o Maintain hanger spacing according to slope angle and tray width to prevent sagging .
- o Apply 5-10% safety margins in slope length calculations to accommodate installation tolerances .
- o Use the SVG fabrication diagram from calculators for direct on-site marking, reducing errors and improving efficiency . By carefully planning, using the correct tools, and following safety guidelines, you can cut cable trays for climbing slopes efficiently while maintaining structural integrity and compliance with industry standards .
