

How to fix cables in a trapezoidal cable tray diagram

Step 5: Use Covers and Accessories

Install tray covers if the environment exposes cables to dust, moisture, or mechanical hazards. Modular accessories such as elbows, tees, and junctions help maintain proper cable alignment and simplify future



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modifications . For corrosive environments, select trays and accessories made of stainless steel, FRP, or coated aluminum.

Step 6: Inspection and Maintenance

After installation, inspect the tray for sagging, loose ties, or misaligned cables. Periodically check for wear, corrosion, or cable displacement, especially after adding new cables or performing maintenance . Proper labeling of cables improves troubleshooting and reduces downtime.
