

# How to fuse pigtail and fiber optic cable

- o Align and Splice
  - o Place the prepared fiber and pigtail into the fusion splicer clamps.
  - o The splicer automatically aligns the fibers using cameras or sensors.
  - o Initiate the fusion process; the splicer melts the fiber ends together to form a continuous optical path .
- o Protect the Splice
  - o Slide a heat-shrink splice sleeve over the fused joint.
  - o Apply heat to shrink the sleeve, providing mechanical protection and strain relief .
- o Test the Splice
  - o Use an OTDR (Optical Time-Domain Reflectometer) or power meter to verify the splice quality and ensure low insertion loss .

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- o Always use pre-tested, high-quality pigtails to reduce errors .
- o Maintain a clean, dust-free environment; even small contaminants can degrade performance .
- o Avoid bending the fiber sharply; maintain a minimum bending radius of 30 mm during handling .
- o Follow manufacturer recommendations for consumables and splicing parameters to ensure long-term reliability . By following these steps and best practices, you can achieve a reliable, low-loss fusion splice between a fiber optic pigtail and a fiber optic cable, suitable for data centers, telecom networks, or FTTH deployments .
