- o Installation date Incorporate color coding for quick visual identification: yellow for single-mode, orange or aqua for multimode, and connector colors to indicate fiber type (blue for single-mode UPC, green for single-mode APC, beige or aqua for multimode), .

Use Durable Materials

Select high-quality, weather-resistant labels suitable for the environment. Thermal-printed labels or industrial label printers (e.g., Brother P Touch, Brady) provide long-lasting readability and resist temperature changes, moisture, and handling .

Audit and Document

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After relabeling, update network documentation and perform a full audit to ensure all cables are correctly identified. Regular audits (quarterly or semi-annually) help maintain label integrity and prevent future mislabeling. Maintain a clear record of changes for compliance and operational efficiency.
