

How to install a small fiber optic junction box

- o Insert connectors and adapters into the designated slots, ensuring proper alignment to prevent signal loss .
- o Label each fiber connection for future reference .

- o Check that all connections are tight and stable .
- o Use a fiber optic power meter or OTDR to verify signal transmission quality .
