

How to install the terminal blocks in a distribution box

Testing and Verification

After wiring, use a multimeter to verify continuity and insulation resistance without disconnecting the conductors . Ensure no exposed wires or loose connections remain, as these can cause shorts or electrical hazards .

- o Always connect the grounded terminal last when re-energizing circuits to reduce the risk of sparks .
- o Avoid overfilling terminals; follow the manufacturer's specifications for the number of wires per terminal .
