

How to reserve cable wires in cable trays

Reserving wires in cable trays involves planning cable routes, separating different types, securing them properly, and ensuring compliance with fill and safety standards.

Planning and Layout

Before installing cables, plan the tray layout carefully. Identify the types of cables (power, control, data) and their routes. Use dividers or separate sections within the tray to prevent interference between power and signal cables, as electrical noise can affect sensitive circuits . Ladder trays are ideal for large power cables due to ventilation, while ventilated troughs support smaller control or instrumentation cables .

Securing and Spacing

Cables should be secured near connection points using cable ties or clamps to reduce stress on terminations . Maintain spacing between different cable types according to national or local electrical codes. Dividers or physical separation help prevent overheating and signal interference .

Cable Tray Fill

Calculate the tray fill to avoid overcrowding. Use NEC 392.22 rules for single-conductor and multiconductor cables, ensuring the total cross-sectional area does not exceed the tray's allowable fill . A common practice is to limit fill to 40% for power cables and 50% for control or signal cables, leaving space for air circulation and heat dissipation .

Grounding and Bonding

Ensure the entire tray system is properly grounded. Connect all tray sections with bonding jumpers to maintain electrical continuity. This protects personnel and equipment from faults and reduces interference .

Labeling and Documentation

Label each cable clearly at regular intervals and at both ends. Maintain up-to-date drawings and cable schedules to simplify maintenance and future upgrades . Proper documentation prevents confusion and reduces the risk of errors during modifications.
