

How to wire an additional circuit breaker in a distribution box

Adding a new circuit breaker involves turning off the main power, selecting the correct breaker, connecting hot, neutral, and ground wires, and testing the circuit for safety.

Step 1: Safety First

Before starting, turn off the main breaker to cut power to the panel. Use a non-contact voltage tester to ensure no live electricity is present. Wear insulated gloves and safety glasses to protect against accidental shocks ().

Step 2: Plan the Circuit

- o Identify the location for the new breaker in the panel. Leave space for future expansion if possible ().

- o Hammer out the knockouts in the panel for wire entry.

- o Hot wire (black or red): Connect to the terminal screw on the new breaker. Ensure the breaker clicks securely onto the bus bar ().
- o Neutral wire (white): Connect to the neutral bus bar. Keep wires organized to avoid confusion.
- o Ground wire (bare copper or green): Connect to the grounding bus bar. In a main panel, the neutral and ground may be bonded; in a subpanel, they should remain separate ().

Step 5: Install the Breaker

- o Slide the breaker into the slot on the bus bar until it clicks.
- o Double-check that the breaker is rated for the panel and the circuit load.

Step 6: Test the Circuit

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- o Turn the main breaker back on.
- o Switch on the new breaker and use a multimeter to verify voltage and continuity.
- o Test connected devices or outlets to ensure proper operation ().

Additional Tips

- o Always follow local electrical codes and regulations.
- o If unsure, consult a licensed electrician.
- o Keep a wiring diagram of your panel for future reference ().
