

How to wire the resistor on the distribution box

Preparation and Safety

After wiring, use a multimeter to check for continuity, correct voltage, and absence of short circuits before powering on . Gradually energize the circuit and monitor the resistor box for proper operation.

- o Avoid overloading the resistor box beyond its rated capacity.
