- o Splice trays to hold and protect fused fibers.
- o Adapters or couplers to connect pigtails to patch cords.

- o Storage space for excess fiber to maintain proper bend radius and prevent damage .

How to Connect the Fiber Optic Cable

- o Prepare the Cable: Remove the outer jacket and buffer coating of the fiber optic cable to expose the individual fiber strands. Ensure the fibers are clean and free of dust .
- o Fix the Cable in the Box: Secure the incoming fiber cable using the clamps or ties inside the terminal box to prevent movement .
- o Splice or Connect Fibers:
 - o Fusion Splicing: Align the fiber core with a pigtail and fuse them using a fusion splicer. Place the spliced fiber in the splice tray for protection .
 - o Mechanical Splicing: Use a mechanical splice if fusion splicing is not available. This method aligns the fibers in a connector without permanent fusion .
- o Connect to Adapters: Insert the pigtail ends into the fiber adapters (SC, LC, FC, or ST connectors) in the terminal box. These adapters allow easy connection to patch cords or devices .
- o Organize and Protect: Coil any excess fiber neatly in the storage area of the box, maintaining the minimum bend radius (usually $\geq 30\text{mm}$) to prevent signal loss or damage .
- o Test the Connection: Use an OTDR or power meter to verify continuity and signal integrity before closing the box .
- o Close the Box: Ensure the lid is tightly closed to protect fibers from dust and environmental interference .

Safety and Maintenance Tips

- o Always handle fibers carefully to avoid breakage or injury.

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- o Keep the terminal box clean and dry, especially if installed outdoors.
- o Regularly inspect for loose connections, dust, or damage.
- o Use proper cleaning tools like isopropyl alcohol wipes for connectors . By following these steps, the fiber optic cable in the terminal box can be securely connected to pigtails or patch cords, ensuring reliable data transmission and network performance.
