Lebanese Standards are established and regulated by LIBNOR, the Lebanese Standards Institution, which issues national standards and grants the Lebanese Conformity Mark (NL) to ensure product compliance.

Overview of LIBNOR

The Lebanese Standards Institution (LIBNOR) is a public institution under the Ministry of Industry, established in 1962. It is the sole authority in Lebanon responsible for issuing, publishing, and amending national standards and for authorizing the use of the Lebanese Conformity Mark (NL), which certifies that products comply with Lebanese standards . While most standards are voluntary, certain standards can be made mandatory by a decree from the Council of Ministers for reasons of public safety, health, or national interest .

Standardization Process

Standards are developed by technical committees composed of representatives from public and private sectors, including ministries, universities, laboratories, industry associations, and NGOs . LIBNOR prepares annual programs for drafting new standards or amending existing ones, which are approved by its Board of Directors . Written procedures for standards development have been established, and LIBNOR is certified according to ISO 9001, reflecting its commitment to quality management .

International Affiliations

LIBNOR is actively involved in international standardization. It is a full member of ISO, an affiliate member of the European Committee for Standardization (CEN), and participates in the Codex Alimentarius Commission, AIDMO, RNF, and SMIIC . This international engagement ensures that Lebanese standards align with global practices and facilitates trade.

Lebanese Conformity Mark (NL)

The NL Conformity Mark is granted to products that meet Lebanese standards, enhancing product quality, safety, and marketability both locally and internationally . It serves as a symbol of compliance and is particularly important for exporters seeking to demonstrate adherence to recognized standards.

Role in Trade and Quality

LIBNOR supports trade by providing access to national, regional, and international standards, offering training, and answering technical queries . It also collaborates with other government bodies to ensure that technical regulations, ministerial decisions, and decrees are consistent with national standards . This

framework helps protect public health, safety, and the environment while facilitating Lebanese exports .

Recent Developments

In recent years, LIBNOR has undergone reorganization to become internationally oriented, creating mirror committees for ISO, CEN, and Codex, and focusing on sectors such as electro-technical standards . The institution continues to strengthen its national presence and international participation, ensuring that Lebanese standards remain relevant and globally recognized.
