Cable trays and trunking should be securely fixed using wall-mounted brackets, ceiling-mounted supports, or suspension rods, with proper spacing and alignment to ensure safety, accessibility, and compliance with standards.

General Installation Principles

Preparation and Inspection: Before installation, all materials should be inspected for damage and approved by the project engineer. Ensure the installation area is accessible, clean, and free from hazards. Components should be stored above ground, protected from moisture, sunlight, and construction debris . **Support and Spacing:**

- o Cable trays are typically supported at intervals not exceeding 1.2 meters for straight runs, while trunking is supported at 2-meter intervals .

 - o Supports should prevent deflection exceeding 5 mm at mid-span when fully loaded .

 - o Use standard connectors and expansion fittings where required.
 - o Cut edges should be treated and painted to prevent corrosion.
 - o Cable retaining bars or non-hygroscopic insulating devices should be used where cables could fall out when covers are removed .
 - o All unused holes should be sealed with grommets. **Cable Securing:**
 - o Cables should be tied or strapped to prevent movement.
 - o For large or bunched cables, cleats or metal straps are recommended .
 - o Maintain a minimum clearance of 40-50 mm from structural elements or floors to avoid direct contact .

- o Installation should follow relevant standards (e.g., BS EN 61537 for trays, BS 6946 for channel supports) and manufacturer recommendations .
 - o Personnel must be trained and follow health and safety protocols, including the use of scaffolding, lifting

- o Verify that all fixings, supports, and bonding jumpers are correctly installed.
