A fiber optic pigtail is a short optical fiber cable with a factory-installed connector on one end and a bare fiber on the other, primarily used for fusion or mechanical splicing in optical networks.

Definition and Purpose

A fiber optic pigtail is a short length of optical fiber with a connector on one end and a bare fiber on the other. The connector end plugs into network equipment, optical distribution frames (ODFs), or adapters, while the bare fiber end is permanently spliced to incoming fiber cables, ensuring low-loss connections and reliable network performance. Unlike patch cords, which have connectors on both ends, pigtails are designed for field termination and splicing.
