To power a fiber optic router, first connect the Optical Network Terminal (ONT) to its power source, then plug in the router, ensuring both devices are near electrical outlets and properly ventilated.

Step-by-Step Guide

1. Prepare Your Equipment Ensure you have the following: a fiber optic modem or ONT (provided by your ISP), a compatible router, power adapters for both devices, and Ethernet cables to link the ONT to the router .

 4. Power the Router
 - o Plug the router's power adapter into a nearby outlet.
 - o Turn on the router and wait for the indicator lights to confirm a successful connection. The router should now be receiving the internet signal from the ONT .
 5. Optimal Placement and Safety
 - o Place both the ONT and router in a dry, well-ventilated area, away from moisture or extreme temperatures.
 - o Consider using a surge protector to safeguard your devices.
 - o Avoid bending fiber cables sharply or placing them under tension, as this can degrade signal quality .
- Following this sequence ensures that your fiber optic router is properly powered and ready to distribute high-speed internet throughout your home or office.
