North American distribution boards are generally housed in enclosures, with the components positioned in two columns operable from the front. Some panelboards are provided with a door covering the front. Despite the adoption of a standard for mounting and a standard cut-out shape for seemingly interchangeable breakers, the positions of busbar connections and other features are not standardized. Each manufacturer has its own standards.
