

# Removal of cold splice for leather cable

## Article Overview

To remove a cold splice from a leather cable, carefully cut out the splice section, strip the cable ends, and prepare them for a new splice while avoiding damage to the cable core and insulation.

## Step-by-Step Procedure

1. **Safety First** Before starting, ensure the cable is de-energized and properly grounded to prevent electrical hazards. Wear protective gloves and eye protection, especially when handling high-voltage or thick leather-jacketed cables . 2. **Identify and Cut Out the Splice** Locate the cold splice section. Using a sharp utility knife or cable cutter, remove the entire splice area, including any damaged insulation, connectors, or tape. If multiple splices are close together, remove all affected sections and consolidate into a single splice to reduce weak points . 3. **Strip the Cable Ends** Carefully strip back the leather jacket and any underlying insulation. For leather cables, taper the jacket ends to about six times the thickness of the jacket to ensure proper adhesion when re-splicing . Avoid nicking or cutting the conductor strands or shielding. 4. **Prepare Conductors and Shielding** Trim the conductor strands evenly and squarely. If the cable has shielding, remove or fold it back neatly without leaving loose threads or sharp points. This ensures a clean surface for the new splice and prevents future electrical issues . 5. **Clean and Inspect** Clean the exposed conductors and insulation with a suitable solvent or alcohol to remove dirt, oils, or oxidation. Inspect for any damage to the core or insulation that may require additional trimming or replacement . 6. **Re-Splice or Terminate** Once the old splice is removed and the cable ends are prepared, install a new splice using a method compatible with the cable type, such as heat-shrink, molded, or prefabricated connectors. Ensure proper insulation, shielding, and jacket restoration to maintain cable integrity . 7. **Test the Cable** After re-splicing, perform electrical testing to verify continuity, insulation resistance, and overall functionality before returning the cable to service .

## Key Considerations

- o Always match the splice type to the cable specifications.
- o Avoid excessive bending or twisting of the cable during removal.
- o Ensure the leather jacket is restored or replaced to maintain mechanical protection.
- o Follow manufacturer guidelines for high-voltage or specialized cables to prevent failures . By following these steps, a cold splice in a leather cable can be safely removed and replaced, ensuring the cable remains reliable and functional.
