Placement and Purpose

In a typical distribution box, circuit breakers are arranged from left to right, with the main switch or main breaker usually on the far left. The reserved or spare switch position is commonly located on the right side of the distribution box. This reserved slot is intended for future use, allowing additional circuits to be added without major rewiring or modifications to the existing panel .

Wiring Considerations

- o **Wiring Direction:** Wiring between the main breaker and branch circuit breakers generally runs on the left side, while wiring exiting the distribution box goes on the right .
- o **Wire Color Coding:** Standard color codes should be followed--neutral wires are blue, and phase wires are typically yellow (A phase), green (B phase), and red (C phase), .
- o **Wire Size:** Select wire specifications according to the load; for example, lighting and socket circuits often use 2.5mm² wires, while air conditioning circuits may require 2.5mm² or 4.0mm² wires .
- o **Binding and Organization:** Wires should be neatly tied with plastic ties, spaced uniformly, and routed to avoid crossing or tangling .

Safety and Maintenance

- o **Marking:** Clearly label all circuits, including the reserved position, to indicate potential future use .
- o **Inspection:** After installation, perform a safety inspection to ensure there are no short circuits, overloads, or loose connections .
- o **Accessibility:** Ensure the reserved switch is easily accessible for future installation without disturbing existing circuits .
