An in-home distribution box, also called a consumer unit, load center, or electrical panel, is the central point where incoming power is divided into branch circuits for lighting, appliances, and other loads . The box protects wiring and users by housing circuit breakers, RCDs, RCBOs, surge protection devices, and busbars . Choosing the right size ensures sufficient space for current circuits and future expansion, such as EV chargers or solar panels .

Common Sizes and Slot Counts

- o Slot counts ("ways"): Residential boxes typically range from 12-way to 24-way, where each "way" accommodates a single circuit breaker. Some slots are reserved for the main switch or surge protection devices .
- o Wall-mounted enclosures: Typical external dimensions range from 200 x 200 x 120 mm for compact units up to 800 x 600 x 300 mm for larger residential panels .
- o Internal layout considerations: Usable space is slightly smaller than external dimensions due to wall thickness, mounting hardware, and DIN rail placement . Proper spacing ensures safe wiring, heat dissipation, and ease of installation.

Selection Considerations

- o Rated current and short-circuit capacity: Choose a box that matches your home's load and potential fault current .
- o Future-proofing: Allow extra slots for additional circuits, EV chargers, or solar inverters .
- o Protection devices: Ensure space for MCBs, RCDs, RCBOs, and surge protection devices .
- o Mounting and IP rating: Wall-mounted boxes should meet IP standards for dust and moisture protection, typically IP44 or higher for residential use .
- o Compliance: Follow local electrical codes such as NEC (US) or IEC standards for safety and installation .

A slightly larger box with extra ways is often more cost-effective than replacing a full panel later. Compact plastic or FRP enclosures are suitable for low-power circuits, while metal boxes provide durability
