ONU Deployment in Sudan

The United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (UNOCHA) in Sudan has initiated the deployment of fiber-optic internet services to its offices in Khartoum, Omdurman, Kadugli, Damazine, Kassala, Kosti, and Port Sudan to support humanitarian operations . This deployment involves the use of Optical Network Units (ONUs), which are devices that convert optical signals from fiber-optic cables into electrical signals usable by computers, routers, and other devices . The ONU serves as a critical interface between the service provider's optical network and end-user equipment, enabling high-speed, reliable internet access.

Technical Role of ONU

An ONU functions as a translator between light-based signals and electrical signals, allowing multiple services such as data, voice, and IPTV to be delivered over a single fiber connection . In a Passive Optical Network (PON), the ONU communicates with the Optical Line Terminal (OLT) at the provider's central office, handling both downstream and upstream data transmission. This ensures secure, uninterrupted, and dedicated connectivity, which is essential for UN operations in Sudan, especially in areas affected by conflict and humanitarian crises .

Benefits for Humanitarian Operations

By adopting ONU technology, Sudan's UN offices can achieve:

- o High-speed connectivity with bandwidth ranging from 10 Mbps to 100 Mbps for both download and upload .
- o Reliable and stable internet access for coordination of aid, communication, and data management.
- o Support for multiple users and services simultaneously, including emergency communications, remote monitoring, and teleconferencing . This infrastructure is particularly important given Sudan's ongoing humanitarian challenges, including displacement, famine, and limited access to basic services . The ONU deployment ensures that UN staff can maintain operational efficiency and provide timely assistance to affected populations.
