Step 1: Verify Physical Connections

Ensure that the fiber optic cable is securely connected to the Optical Network Terminal (ONT) or fiber modem, and that the Ethernet cable links the ONT to your router's WAN port. Check for visible damage, sharp bends, or loose connectors, as these can cause signal loss or intermittent connectivity ().

Step 2: Power Cycle Devices

Turn off both the fiber modem/ONT and the router. Wait 30 seconds, then power on the modem first, allowing its status lights to stabilize (usually 2-5 minutes). Next, power on the router and observe the indicator lights. A solid or blinking green/white light typically indicates a successful connection ().

Step 3: Check ISP Credentials

Many fiber connections require a PPPoE username and password provided by your ISP. Without these credentials, the router cannot authenticate with the network. If you have not received them, contact your ISP to obtain the access data, including any connection identifiers or access numbers ().

Step 4: Configure Router Settings

Access your router's admin panel (commonly via 192.168.1.1) and verify the following:

- o Connection type: PPPoE (if required by ISP)
- o Enter the ISP-provided username and password
- o Ensure the WAN port is set to the correct mode (some routers auto-detect dynamic IP, but fiber may require PPPoE or static IP) ().

Step 5: Test Direct Connection

If the router still cannot connect, try connecting a computer directly to the ONT using an Ethernet cable. If the computer cannot access the internet, the issue may be with the fiber line or ISP configuration rather than your router ().



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Step 6: Inspect Hardware and Firmware

- o Check for firmware updates for your router.
- o Ensure the router supports fiber connections (SFP or WAN port compatible with ONT).
- o Replace any suspect cables or transceivers if necessary ().

Step 7: Contact ISP Support

If all steps fail, contact your ISP. Provide details about your router model, ONT, and any error lights. They can verify your account, provide missing credentials, and check for line or configuration issues ().
