

Tips for installing electrical cable trays

Planning and Route Design

- o Ventilated trough trays: Offer continuous support for smaller control or instrumentation cables .
- o Solid-bottom trays: Suitable for sensitive cables requiring protection from debris or liquids.
- o FRP trays: Corrosion-resistant and non-conductive, ideal for high-moisture or chemical environments .

Sizing and Cable Fill

Calculate tray width and depth based on the number and type of cables. Do not exceed fill limits: 40% for power cables and 50% for control cables . Proper sizing prevents overheating and ensures safe cable management.

Mounting and Support

Secure trays using appropriate clamps, brackets, or hangers. Support spacing typically ranges from 1.5 to 3 meters depending on tray type and load . Ensure trays are level, straight, and aligned with connectors and fittings. Inspect all trays and accessories for damage before installation .

Grounding and Bonding

Metallic trays can serve as equipment grounding conductors if installed according to NEC requirements . Ensure all bonding and grounding connections are properly made to maintain electrical safety.

Installation Best Practices

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- o Follow approved shop drawings and specifications strictly .
- o Maintain at least 12 inches of vertical clearance above trays for access and maintenance .
- o Separate high-power and low-power cables to prevent electromagnetic interference .
- o Handle materials carefully to avoid coating damage, especially for GI trays .
- o Clearly label each tray section by feeder name and branch number .
