- o **Compliance:** Use UL/CE-certified components and follow local electrical codes (NEC, IEC, or regional standards) to ensure safety and regulatory compliance .
- o **Installation Environment:** Choose a dry, accessible location with proper ventilation, typically around 1.5 meters above the floor for easy access .
