Optical modules are hot-pluggable transceivers used in high-bandwidth data communications, converting electrical signals to optical signals and vice versa . The CFP (C Form-factor Pluggable) module is a standard form factor defined by a multi-source agreement (MSA) for high-speed digital signal transmission.

- o "C" in CFP: The letter "C" represents the Latin letter C, which is used to denote the number 100 (centum in Latin). This naming reflects that the original CFP specification was primarily developed to support 100 Gigabit Ethernet systems .

- o CFP2 and CFP4: These are subsequent iterations of the CFP standard. While electrically similar, CFP2 and CFP4 specify smaller form factors--1/2 and 1/4 the size of the original CFP, respectively--allowing higher port density while maintaining compatibility at the optical interface . The "C" designation is therefore tied to the intended data rate rather than the physical characteristics of the module itself. This naming convention helps distinguish high-speed modules from earlier or lower-speed optical transceivers, such as SFP or XENPAK modules, which were designed for 10 or 40 Gigabit Ethernet . Understanding this helps in selecting the correct optical module for network equipment, ensuring compatibility with the intended data rate and form factor.
