

What type of cable clip should be used for fiber optic cable

Types of Fiber Optic Cable Clips

1. Push-Grip Clips: These are single-component, taper-lock clips designed specifically for fiber optic cables. They can hold multiple cables in separate slots and are easy to install or remove using clip-on, screw, or adhesive mounting. They accommodate different cable diameters, typically ranging from 2.9mm to 6mm, and help prevent unwanted movement and stress on the fibers . 3. Wall-Mount, Surface-Mount, and D-Ring Clamps: These clamps are used for overhead, ceiling, or surface installations. Wall-mount and surface-mount clamps secure cables to walls, floors, or equipment racks, while D-ring clamps hook around the cable and lock in place without crimping. T-clamps are suitable for outdoor aerial installations where wind and vibration are factors .

Material and Safety Considerations

- o Metal or Fire-Resistant Clips: For compliance with BS7671 and BS6701 standards, all fiber optic cables must be supported by metal or fire-resistant fixings. Plastic clips are generally avoided in regulated installations because they can melt in a fire .
- o Corrosion Resistance: Clips used outdoors or in industrial environments should be corrosion-resistant to ensure long-term durability .

Installation Tips

- o Select a clip size that matches the cable diameter to avoid crushing or excessive movement.
- o Use clips that allow easy removal or adjustment for maintenance.
- o For multiple cables, consider clips with multiple slots to organize and separate fibers.
- o Ensure clips are compatible with the mounting surface, whether adhesive, screw, or clip-on.
