- o Patch Panels: In some cases, cold connectors are plugged into fiber patch panels to facilitate flexible network reconfiguration or temporary connections.

Important Considerations

- o Connector Type Compatibility: Ensure the connector type (e.g., SC/APC or SC/UPC) matches the adapter or device port. APC and UPC types are not interchangeable, as mismatching can cause excess insertion loss and damage ferrule endfaces.
- o Insertion and Return Loss: High-quality cold connectors typically have insertion loss $\leq 0.5\text{dB}$ and return loss $\geq 50\text{dB}$ (UPC) or $\geq 60\text{dB}$ (APC), which is critical for maintaining network performance.
- o Fiber Type: Confirm compatibility with the fiber type (e.g., G.652D or G.657A) and cable diameter (2mm or 3mm) to ensure proper alignment and minimal signal loss.
- o Field Installation: Cold connectors are ideal for quick field installation, requiring minimal tools and no power source, making them suitable for remote or emergency scenarios.
