These terminals can accommodate multiple conductors, often using stud or screw connections, and are designed to handle rated currents up to several hundred amperes depending on the system. They are typically mounted on DIN rails or directly on the back panel of the distribution box for organized and secure connections .

In fiber optic networks, a distribution box terminal is the point inside a fiber distribution box (FDB) or fiber access terminal (FAT) where the incoming feeder fiber is split and routed to multiple drop fibers leading to end users . These terminals provide secure splicing, connectorization, and sometimes include PLC splitters to divide one optical signal into multiple outputs. They are designed to protect fibers from environmental and mechanical stress while allowing easy access for maintenance and troubleshooting .
